Here I am, ready and willing to accept the holy work of *taharah* in the new year.<sup>1</sup> I set my intention for this time: may I be fully present in body, heart, mind, and spirit. May I be guided with compassion as I prepare someone for burial with cleansing water. May I be held and cleansed in *mayyim hayyim*, in these living waters.

Four Ammersions

# ד טבילה דיעובאלה דיעובאלה To be read at the mikveh's edge before you enter the water:

Water is God's gift to living souls, to cleanse us, to purify us, to sustain us and to renew us.<sup>2</sup> As I immerse in *mayyim hayyim*, let me be present and open. May I be renewed and refreshed, ready to continue my holy work in the coming year.

## **FIRST IMMERSION**

Slowly descend the steps into the mikveh waters and immerse completely so that every part of your body is covered by the warm water. When you emerge, recite the following blessing:

בְרוּדְ אַתָּה, יְיָ אֱלֹהֵינוּ, מֶלֶדְ הָעוֹלָם Baruch atah, Adonai Eloheinu, Melech ha'olam אַשֵּׁר קַדְשָׁנוּ בָּטְבִילָה בְּמַיִם חַיִּים.

Blessed are You, God, Majestic Spirit of the Universe who makes us holy by embracing us in living waters.<sup>3</sup>

#### **SECOND IMMERSION**

Take a deep breath and exhale completely, while gently and completely immersing for the second time. When you emerge, recite the following blessing:

תוֹכָר נַפָּשִׁי אֶת קדְשַׁת הַגוּף Tizkor nafshi et k'dushat haguf 4

I call to mind the holiness of the body:<sup>5</sup> my own and those I lovingly prepare for burial.

## **THIRD IMMERSION**

Relax, and let your body soften, as you slowly and completely immerse for the third time. When you emerge, recite the following:

ויהי נעַם אַדנָי אֱלהינו עָלֵינו	Vihi no'am Adonai Eloheinu aleinu
וּמַאֲשֵׂה יָדֵינוּ כּוֹנְנָה עָלֵינוּ	u'ma'aseih yadeinu kon'nah aleinu
וּמַעֲשֵׂה יָדֵינוּ כּוֹנְנְהוּ.	u'ma'aseih yadeinu kon'nei'hu.

May God's pleasantness rest upon us and may the work of our hands be blessed; please, God, may our efforts prosper.<sup>6</sup>

## FOURTH IMMERSION

Take a deep breath, exhale completely and immerse for a fourth time. When you emerge, recite the following:

May God, Whom we call Mikveh Yisrael, God who is the source of living waters, be with me in the coming year to guide my hands and my heart as I continue in sacred service.

Take a moment to reflect on your intentions for the new year and on the blessings of your work.

As I emerge from the *mikveh*, may all obstacles and distractions be washed away and may I perform the holy act of *taharah* with an open and loving spirit.
